


Meet Judy Chapman, Redeemer's New Parish Secretary

It was my first time. I'm sure many of you have had the experience I had, and I suspect it was as special for you as it was for me.

My granddaughter, Hannah, just turned one year old. Nan and I made our way to Texas, where she lives, to celebrate the occasion. While we were there, Sunday came along and we all got ready and went to the church where Michael, Kristie, and Hannah worship. I've been there before, and I love it when I get to go. The people are warm and friendly and welcoming: a lot like it is here at Redeemer. Maybe that's why it feels so much like home.

We were sitting in the pews, having heard a great sermon and sung some good hymns, and we came to the part of the service with communion. As we sat waiting the turn of the folks on our pew to go forward, Nan nudged me and pointed to Kristie. I looked, and Kristie whispered, "Would

you like to carry Hannah to the altar rail?"

Now, like I said, I suspect many of you have had that experience of carrying your child or grandchild to the altar, but this was the first time for me. It was special.

Hannah and I walked forward and she sat so comfortably and serenely in my arms.

It was clear she had been to the rail before, but not with me. Not in my arms.

I knelt there with Hannah in my arms as the pastor came along with a morsel of bread for me-"The body of Christ given for you" - and a blessing for Hannah. It was a special time. It was special. It was time.



You see, as I knelt there with Hannah, I found myself thinking about how I am now the oldest in my family, and Hannah is the youngest. Nevertheless, in spite of the years that separate us, God's love and grace blessed us both.

In that moment, time didn't exist. Hannah and I were both loved children of God despite the difference in our ages. It's more than that too.

One of the things we believe about Holy Communion is that the celebration of it transcends time. For those moments, time doesn't exist. As we kneel at the rail, we are celebrating the meal with those disciples at the last supper. Jesus is really present blessing the meal and saying to us "This is my body, this is my blood, given for you."



That's not all. You see as we kneel at the rail, both time and space are suspended. We are at the rail with Peter, with Paul, with Luther, with our parents who may be long gone, and with our grandparents whether they are holding you or not. In fact, we are communing with every Christian from every time and every place: all who have

ever taken Holy Communion anywhere.

It is special. It is a special time beyond time. Jesus is with us.

Thank you, Hannah. May we always share this meal together with Jesus.



Denise Anderson who helped by applying the money we received to purchase a variety of



When I went to seminary I felt like one of my primary textbooks should be a dictionary.

There were so many long words that often had a much simpler meaning. But yet, we still use those big fancy words. And here's a little secret... often I still have to look up many of these long words to make sure I know exactly what they mean. So, I figured we could look at these words together in a monthly newsletter article.

Let's look at Benediction.

Benediction - Literally describes the utterance of good wishes. Within Christianity, those good wishes often come in the form of a blessing. The most common place this word is

used describes the bless-

ing of the congregation after Holy Communion and before the conclusion of the worship service. The word "benediction" comes from the Latin bene meaning "good" and dicere meaning "say."

The blessing that a benediction conveys is one of God's blessing upon creation. We can find a variety of these blessings in scripture. "May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us, that your way may be known upon earth, your saving power among all nations." Psalm 67:1-2. Other blessings or benedictions can be found throughout the Old and New Testament.

My favorite benediction comes from Numbers chapter 6. God spoke to Moses giving him instructions to have Aaron speak to the people of Israel. "The Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord's face shine upon you and be gracious to you; may



the Lord's countenance look

upon you and give you peace." What a comfort to know that God gave these words to the Israelites and also to us today.
